Big Idea

When the church has more people serving in ministry, it lightens the burden for everyone and helps the Gospel message spread.



Icebreaker

Think back to group projects in school. Were you the type to take charge, or did you go along for the ride?



Discussion Questions

1. We have been challenged to read 28 chapters of Acts across 28 days. Using the SOAP method (Scripture, Observation, Application, Prayer), everyone will have seven different observations each week. What is one of your observations from this week? (Acts 8-14 this week, starting Sunday.)
2. Read **Acts 6:1**. It is said that 20% of the people do 80% of the work. Do you think that's accurate? Why do you think the burden is so uneven? What would it look like if those numbers were more balanced?
3. Read **Acts 6:2-4**. Even though the issue wasn't the apostles' direct responsibility, they still cared about it and thoughtfully delegated it. Are you good at delegating responsibilities as needed? What responsibilities might you need to take off your plate right now?
4. Read **Acts 6:5-6**. Who are some people that God brought into your life to serve you? What did they do? What was the impact?
5. Read **Acts 6:7**. How did having appointed workers help the early church grow? How could it help Watermark Wesleyan and our partner ministries grow?



Concluding Questions

Read **Matthew 9:35-38**. You have the opportunity to literally be an answer to someone's prayers. What are some ministry areas, in our church or outside of it, that you could contribute to? Where could your community group potentially serve together?

1. What do you think the Holy Spirit may be saying to you through this sermon and our discussion?
2. What is something God wants you to do now?
3. Beyond prayer for each other, is there a way we can help each other apply what God is showing us?
