

# Sermon Discussion Guide

## **Unstoppable – Week 4**

### ***A Family Transformed***

**May 2, 2021**



### **Big Idea**

God can use our darkest hour to forever change us and bring a community to Christ.



### **Icebreaker**

What are you most excited for this spring? Do you have any family trips or gatherings planned?



### **Discussion Questions**

1. We have been challenged to read 28 chapters of Acts across 28 days and write one observation from each chapter. What is one of your observations from this week? (Acts 22-28 this week, starting Sunday.)
2. Read **Romans 10:9-10**. When we proclaim and believe in Jesus, we receive salvation. Have you taken that step? When was the moment you accepted Jesus?
3. Read **Acts 16:25-30**. The jailer was at a low point, even choosing death, but it quickly became the high point of his life. What was a low point in your life that God lifted you from?
4. Read **Acts 16:31-32**. The Gospel message was shared with the jailer and spread to his family. How did this contribute to the church being unstoppable? Have you seen examples of this personally?
5. Read **Acts 16:33**. Baptism is symbolic of Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection and is a public testimony to a relationship with him. Have you been baptized? If so, describe the experience. If not, what's stopping you?



### **Concluding Questions**

Read **Acts 16:34**. Experiencing the hope, healing, and grace of Jesus led to a celebration in the middle of the night. Why is celebration important? What can we celebrate now? As we look to be a part of an unstoppable church, what would you like to see us celebrate in the future?



### **Application**

1. What do you think the Holy Spirit may be saying to you through this sermon and our discussion?
2. What is something God wants you to do now?
3. Beyond prayer for each other, is there a way we can help each other apply what God is showing us?
